

They either don't have enough money to get the resources to teach the students or the teacher has to jump through hoops for criteria that don't make sense for the teacher. When the teacher has what they need, that means a much better education for the students.

## CONSIDERING DIFFERENT APPROACHES

## GATHERING IDEAS FROM OTHER YOUNG PEOPLE...

"Teachers are expected to take their work life home, teachers cannot separate the two."

D: "I agree with this, teachers often take their student's quizzes, tests, and homework results home to grade..."

D: "...if a teacher can't even support themselves with their wages I think it needs to change."

"It's quite ridiculous, because the salary is so low that in today's climate you can not support yourself on a teacher's salary, let alone a family...less and less people are going to want to teach because they won't even be able to pay for their own college tuition."

**Possible solution:**  
prioritizing pay.
